<i>Banksia grandis</i>	Bull Banksia, Poolgarla, Pulgarla	1.5m - 8m H (rarely 10m) Tall tree/ multi-stemmed shrub form occasionally available	Coastal planting: second-line, Container-suited, Cut flowers - largest inflorescence of any WA species! Foliage feature - unique zigzag shape, Ornamental feature planting, Sandy soils, Waterwise quality: extremely drought tolerant once established	Sept - jan	Yellow flowers

<i>Banksia sessilis</i>	Parrot Bush	0.5m - 5m Medium/ large shrub	A prickly habitat plant, Drought hardy, Grows in sand over limestone and lateritic gravel soils	April - Nov	Cream-yellow flowers
<i>Banksia serrata*</i> (syn. <i>B. undulata</i>)	Saw Banksia, Old Man Banksia	0.9m - 3m H (15m in favourable conditions) Medium tree	Coastal planting, Ornamental feature planting, Sandy soils, Well-drained soils	Dec - Jun	Green-yellow flowers
<i>Callistemon phoeniceus</i>	Lesser Bottlebrush	1m - 4m H (6m in favourable conditions) Shrub or small tree	Cut flowers, Drought tolerant, Fence-screening, Heavy/ clay soils, Hedging, Sandy soils, Shade, dry shady positions, Tolerates winter-wet soil & dry summers, Water-absorber, Windbreak	Sept - Jan	Red flowers

<i>Eucalyptus wandoo</i>	Wandoo, Wondu, White Gum* *one of multiple Eucalypts referred to as 'White Gum'	8m - 18m H Large tree	Lignotuberous - coppice to promote multi-stemmed habit, Local planting (Kalamunda & Mundaring Shires), Single-trunked tree	Jan - May	White - cream flowers
<i>Grevillea bipinnatifida</i>	Fuchsia Grevillea	1m - 1.5m H x 1.2m - 1.8m W Open, spreading shrub	Full sun or light shade, Large showy flowers (deep red/ orange), Local planting (Kalamunda & Mundaring Shires), Ornamental feature planting, Tolerates dry periods	Mar - Jan	Red-orange flowers peak late winter-spring, intermittent nearly all-year
<i>Grevillea petrophiloides</i>	Pink Pokers, Rock Grevillea, Poker Grevillea	1m - 4m H Medium/ tall shrub	Gravelly soils, Full sun, Ornamental feature planting, Upright, erect habit, Well-drained soils	Jun - Nov	Red flowers peaking in winter-spring, intermittently all-year
<i>Hakea laurina</i>	Pincushion Hakea	3m - 5m H x 3m - 4m W Medium shrub/ small tree	Hardy adaptable garden specimen, Full sun, Loam soils, Sandy soils, Tolerates heavy clay, Well-drained, moist soils	Apr - Aug	Red-pink/ cream flowers
<i>Hakea lissocarpha</i>	Honey Bush	0.4m - 1.5m H (rarely 3m H in favourable conditions) Low/ medium shrub	Lignotuberous - coppice to promote multi-stemmed habit, Local planting (Kalamunda & Mundaring Shires), Sandy soils, Shallow, rocky soils e.g. granite, laterite	May - July	White-pink scented flowers
<i>Hakea prostrata</i>	Harsh Hakea	1m - 3m H Low/ medium shrub	Coastal planting - second-line, Gravelly soils, Loam soils, Local planting (Kalamunda & Mundaring Shires), Perfumed flowers, Privacy hedging - prickly foliage, Sandy soils, Shallow, rocky soils e.g. granite, laterite	Aug - Oct	White flowers
<i>Hakea trifurcata</i>	Two-leaf Hakea	1.5m -- 3m H x 3.5m W Medium/ tall shrub	Gravelly soils, Sandy soils Loam soils, Local planting (Kalamunda & Mundaring Shires, Shallow, rocky soils e.g. granite, laterite	April - Oct	White/cream-pink flowers
<i>Hakea undulata</i>	Wavy-leaf Hakea	1m - 2m H x 2m W	Clay soils/ heavy soils, Gravelly soils Foliage feature - wavy edges on leaves Loam soils, Local planting (Kalamunda & Mundaring Shires), Sandy soils, Shallow, rocky soils e.g. granite, laterite	July - Oct	White flowers
<i>Lambertia inermis</i>	Chittick	3m - 4m H (rarely 8m height as small/medium tree form) Medium shrub, small tree form available	Contrasting foliage - dark green, Full sun to part shade, Hardy, adaptable garden specimen, Tolerates frost, Well-drained soils	Sept - June	Orange-red/ yellow flowers displayed Sep - Dec OR Jan - Jun
<i>Macadamia integrifolia</i> * *hybrids more common in cultivation	Macadamia Nut, Queensland Nut, Bauple Nut, Nut Oak	5m - 12m H x 4m - 6m W (in typical Perth conditions) Tall tree	Clay loam soils, Contrasting foliage - glossy surface, Edible nuts, Full sun to light shade, Hardy, adaptable garden specimen Loamy soils, Sandy loam soils, Tolerates light frost once established Well-drained soils to moist moderate drainage	Mar - May & Sept - Nov	Cream flowers
