They can be planted as late as August, but may have a shorter flowering stem. Fly Queensland Fruit **Detected in Bayswater**

This pest poses a significant threat to the agriculture industry, so DPIRD are aiming to eradicate it from WA. As such we need to monitor for the fruit fly, and report using the MyPestGuide app. Within 15km from Bayswater there is a restriction on selling Kids Potting On Workshop plants with certain fruits on them. So we will be pruning off any fruits from lilly pillies, chillies, citrus and blueberries.


